Subject: Compulsory Attendance of BUMS Students in Govt. Unani Medical College GanderbalReg.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

As per CCIM now called NCISM guidelines notified vide Minimum Standards of Education MSE-2016 of CCIM dated: 07.11.2016, and MSE-UG-Unani Regulations-2022 notified by NCISM, dated: 28.02.2022, each student shall be required to maintain minimum 75% attendance in each subject in Theory (Lecture Hours), Practical & Clinical (Non-Lecture hours) separately for appearing in the examination to be conducted by University Of Kashmir. Six months have been now since the class work has started in the institution but the attendance of students as reported by faculty members shows dismal picture. The faculty members have submitted the attendance report of all students in each batch till date, which shows that many students are already falling shortage of mandatory attendance in their subjects due to which these students cannot be allowed to appear in Examination to be held by University of Kashmir in the year 2025.

It has been also informed that students (2020 Batch) have filed representations before various authorities with the request to allow them to attend Clinical Postings in Modern Medicine Hospitals. It is clarified that as per NCISM guidelines, Clinical postings in final year are to be attended in various sections of the Hospital in groups. Accordingly students of final Prof. were advised to attend clinical classes/postings in Govt. Unani Hospital Nawabagh Ganderbal from 01.03.2025 to 15.03.2025 and in Govt. Unani Hospital Shalteng Srinagar from 17.03.2025 to 31.03.2025. It is also informed that Vehicle has been already arranged by the authorities for transporting students from College Campus to Shalteng Hospital on three days a week from 17.03.2025 onwards.

Lastly, all students are requested especially Final Prof. students (2020 Batch) to attend their classes regularly including clinical postings as per roster already issued, to make college environment more conducive for learning. The attendance of each student subject wise is also displayed on official website for future record and reference so that students attend their classes regularly including their clinical postings.

- (v) The examination branch of the institution shall compile the marks of electives obtained by students as specified above and submit to university through Head of the Institution so that the university shall add the same in viva-voce of respective subjects as shown in *Tables 12, 14 and 16*.
- (i) (i) A candidate obtaining sixty-five per cent. and above marks shall be awarded first class in the subject and seventy-five per cent. and above marks shall be awarded distinction in the subject.
(ii) The award of class and distinction shall not be applicable for supplementary examinations.
- (j) (i) Each student shall be required to maintain minimum seventy-five per cent. attendance in each subject in theory (i.e., lecture hours), practical and clinical (i.e., non-lecture hours) separately for appearing in examination.
(ii) Where the institute maintains physical attendance register, it shall be recorded in cumulative numbering method as per *Annexure-II* and at end of the course/term/part of the course, after obtaining each student signature the same is to be certified by respective Head of the Department and approved by Head of the Institute.
(iii) The approved attendance shall be forwarded to university.
- (k) If a student fails to appear in regular examination for cognitive reasons, he may appear in supplementary examination as regular student and his non-appearance in regular examination shall not be treated as an attempt.
- (l) Notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations,-
(i) clause 10(e) shall be applicable to the student who got admitted under Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Regulations, 1986, except electives and as per section 4 of SCHEDULE III (as amended vide notification no. 11-76/2016-Unani (U.G. Regl.) Regulations, 2016) with 4 professionals.
(ii) student who got admitted under Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Regulations, 1986, the maximum number of chances and maximum period of years to pass respective professional examination as laid down under the clauses 7(1)(c), 2(c), 3(c), 4(c) and 4(d) of SCHEDULE III (as amended vide notification no. 11-76/2016-Unani (U.G. Regl.) Regulations, 2016) shall not be applicable to him.
- 11 **Assessment.-** Assessment of students shall be in the form of Formative and Summative Assessments as under-
- (b) **Formative Assessment.-** Students shall be assessed periodically to assess their performance in the class, determine the understanding of programme material and their learning outcome in the following manner, namely:-
(i) Periodical Assessment shall be carried out at the end of teaching of a topic or module or a particular portion of syllabus and the evaluation methods as per the following table may be adopted as suits to the content, namely:-

(Evaluation methods for periodical assessment)

Sl. No.	Evaluation Method
1.	Practical or Clinical Performance
2.	Viva Voce or Multiple-Choice Question (MCQ) or Modified Essay Question (MEQ) or Structured Questions
3.	Open Book Test (Problem Based)
4.	Summary Writing (Research papers)

- (5) The supplementary examination shall be held within six months of regular examination and failed students shall be eligible to appear in its supplementary examination, as the case may be.
- (6) Each student shall be required to attend not less than three-fourth of the lectures delivered and practicals or demonstrations or clinicals held in each subject during each course and each student also be required to participate in educational trips or tours of the college during the year; provided that the Director or Principal may exempt any one from such participation to the extent he deemed necessary on individual merit in each case.
- (7) In case a student fails to appear in regular examination for cognitive reasons, he shall appear in supplementary examination as regular student, whose non-appearance in regular examination shall not be treated as an attempt and such students after passing examination shall join the studies with regular students and appear for next professional examination after completion of the required period of study.
- (8) The following facts may be taken into consideration in determining class work in the subject-
- Regularity in attendance;
 - Periodical tests; and
 - Practical work.
12. Migration during degree course.-(1) The students may be allowed to take their migration to continue their study to another college after passing the first professional examination, but failed students transfer and mid-term migration shall not be allowed.
- (2) For migration, the students shall have to obtain the mutual consent of both colleges and Universities and it shall be against the vacant seat after obtaining "No Objection Certificate" from Central Council.
